The goal of yoga according to the *Yoga Sutras* is kaivalya, which means aloneness.

According to Sally Kempton, three possible interpretations of dharma are ethical good, life path, and spiritual path.

When, like a tortoise retracting its limbs, he withdraws his senses completely from sensuous objects, his insight is sure.

This verse from the Bhagavad Gita is discussing pratyahara, one of the eight limbs of yoga described in the Yoga Sutras.

Illustrate the following statement with examples from your own life:

Dharma is alive, and it changes, day by day, year by year, and situation by situation.

Right now my dharma is to be a student, to absorb all that I can learn about what I am most interested in about life in this world. I also have other dharmas: to be in relationship as a son/daughter, as a friend, as a worker at my job, as a partner and lover.
